	Whitley County Health Dept. Debra McNaughton	Update on Severe Storms! Several lines of severe thunderstorms are heading to KY. and are expected to bring flooding, possible tornadoes, high winds and hail. Everyone was reminded to keep their weather radio on, purchase one if you don't have one and to watch frequent weather reports. Epic flooding is expected to occur in the West Kentucky. Everyone was reminded to "Turn Around, Don't Drown". The health department will be participating in NLE activities on the local, regional, state and national levels.
	American Red Cross Coy Prichard	Coy Prichard gave an overview of the services of our regional American Red Cross Chapter. He stated that Whitley Co. had 3 certified shelters: Central Baptist Church, Immanuel Baptist Church and Church of the Nazarene- all located in Corbin. He discussed the different types of shelters the ARC offers and requirements necessary to be a Red Cross Volunteer. (The minimum requirements to be a Red Cross Volunteer are to be registered and have a background check performed). He pointed out that any county sponsored shelter was the responsibility of that county whereas ARC shelters were covered under a \$1 million dollar insurance policy and they took full responsibility.
