VI. Other Business	Whitley County Earthquake Exercise Debra McNaughton reported that there would be no statewide Earthquake Exercise this year and suggested that Whitley County have a countywide exercise. The health department would coordinate this exercise along with Whitley Co. Emergency Management.	Agencies within Whitley County are encouraged to participate in the countywide Earthquake Exercise scheduled for February 18 at 10:07 AM. Information about earthquakes and what to do before, during and after an earthquake was given to LEPC members and E-mailed to all participating agencies. Kentucky's past earthquake activity was discussed and everyone received a participation form to be faxed or e-mailed to Debra after the exercise.
VII. Agency Updates	Emergency Management	Danny Moses notified the group that we are now in the Region 9 Emergency Management Area. This affects only Emergency Management. In addition to the snowy weather, Danny reported that the county has lost a few roads due to recent flooding. The flooding also caused a mudslide on Dal Road, closed several county roads and has caused several wrecks. The river is expected to crest tomorrow evening at 27-29 ft.
	Whitley County Health Department	Debra McNaughton gave an H1N1 update. Whitley County has received approximately 11, 100 doses of H1N1 vaccine. The health dept. administered approx. 5,184 of those doses in our offices and thru various open and closed H1N1 clinics. The additional doses were administered thru H1N1 Medical Providers such as BRMC, physician offices and some pharmacies. Numerous clinics were held throughout the county in daycares, all Whitley County schools, University of the Cumberlands, EKU, BRMC, Firestone, etc. The health dept. closely followed CDC Guidelines for H1N1 to the target populations that were most likely to experience critical illness, complications, or death. Debra to schedule additional H1N1 clinics with the University of the Cumberlands and Firestone. It was also mentioned that an Anthrax Declaration was signed by the President of the US on 12-30-09.

Dr. Pennington, Regional Epidemiologist reported that H1N1 seemed to be mutating and encouraged a second dose for children and vaccination for those not already vaccinated. She discussed the misuse of Tamiflu as a possibility for the mutation and reported that most flu was H1N1 and not seasonal influenza. **Snow Storm Coming Our Way!** A significant snowstorm has the potential to affect Whitley County on this Thursday. Kyweathercenter.com Possible Shelter sites were discussed with Whitley Co. getting 8 new cots from the Region 11 Healthcare Group. Sites discussed were -W'burg FD can hold 20 people, Williamsburg Civic Center and possible Corbin sites if needed. Warming stations were discussed and the preferred method of stranded traveler's or persons without electricity. Whitley County School District Lee Schroeder reported that the Whitley County School District was awarded a REMS (Federal Readiness and Emergency Management For Schools) Grant in the amount of \$100, 486. This grant will help with emergency plans, operations, security, crisis management, etc. in the WCSD. He discussed the grant in detail with a handout. Lee is to submit floor plans for each school to Danny Moses for emergency response. University of the Cumberlands Dr. Colegrove reported that the Red Cross was talking with UC to possibly become a shelter for Whitley County. He discussed the numerous assets that the university has to offer the community in a time of crisis. He also volunteered UC for another H1N1 vaccination clinic. This clinic would be for students and the general public. Debra will schedule the clinic at UC. Oak Grove Volunteer Fire Dept. Lee Gilbert reported that Oak Grove responded to over 3,500 calls last year. These calls include fires and car wrecks. He mentioned the training program with Oak Grove and volunteered their services for possible future trainings. **Next Meeting** April 27, 2010 at 10:30 AM Whitley Fiscal Court Room Bob Burns made a motion to adjourn VIII.
